Instructions for recommendation for the award of President's Police

Please find enclosed herewith MHA's Memo No. 11026/03/2015-PMA dated 19th October, 2015 on the subject cited above for information and necessary action.

2. In this regard, also refer MBA's earlier memo no.11026/07/2006/-PMA dated 9th May, 2006 vide which instructions for recalling recommendation for the award of President's Police Medal for Gallantry and Police Medal for Gallantry was forwarded. Recently, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India issued guidelines and also directed that the requirements /norms must be strictly observed in all cases of death and grievous injury in police encounters by treating them as law declared under article 141 of the Constitution of India.

- 3. It is therefore requested that the guidelines of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India must be strictly adhered to. A copy of Magisterial Inquiry in all cases of death and grievous injury in police encounters must be sent with the proposal. In gallantry cases, the date of birth and father's name of the recommendee is also equired.
- In future, proposals may be sent in revised proforma for award of PPMG & MG (copy enclosed). Frontier HQs are also requested to direct all concerned under command to take necessary action as per MHA guidelines.

Instructions for recommendation for the award of President's Police Medal for Gallantry and Police Medal for Gallantry.

dated 9th May 2006 vide which instructions for recalling recommendation for the award of President's Police Medal for Gallantry and Police Medal for Gallantry were circulated. Recently, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its judgment dated 23/09/2014, in Criminal Appeal No.1255 of 1999 titled People's Union for Civil Liberties & Anr V/s State of Maharashtra & others has issued the guidelines regarding sholding of Magisterial enquiry in the cases of death occurred in police firing. (extract attached). The Hon'ble Supreme Court has directed that the requirements/norms must be strictly observed in all cases of death and grievous injury in police encounters by treating them as laws declared under Article 141 of the Constitution of India.

- 2. It is therefore requested that the guidelines of the Hondble Supreme Court of India must be strictly adhered to. A copy of Magisterial Inquiry in all cases of death and grievous injury in police encounter must be sent with the proposal. In gallantry cases, the date of birth and father's name of the recommendee is also required.
- 3. Keeping in view the above requirement, the prescribed proforma has been revised. While sending the proposal for award of President's Police Medal for Gallantry/Police Medal for Gallantry, the requisite information must be sent in revised proforma, prescribed for award of gallantry medal (copy enclosed).

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The following requirements to be followed in the matters of investigating police encounters in the cases of death as the standard procedure for thorough, effective and independent investigation:

- (1) Whenever the police is in receipt of any intelligence or tip-off regarding criminal movements or activities pertaining to the commission of grave criminal Offence, it shall be reduced into writing in some form (preferably into base diary) or in some electronic form. Such recording need not reveal details of the suspect or the location to which the party is headed. If such intelligence or tip-off is received by a higher authority, the same may be noted in some form without revealing details of the suspect or the location.
- If pursuant to the tip-off or receipt of any intelligence, as above, encounter takes place and firearm is used by the police party and as a result of that, death occurs, an FIR to that effect shall be registered and the same shall be forwarded to the court under Section 157 of the Code without any delay. While forwarding the report under Section 157 of the Code, the procedure prescribed under Section 158 of the Code shall be followed.
- (3) An independent investigation into the incident/encounter shall be conducted by the CID or police team of another police station under the supervision of a senior officer (at least a level above the head of the police) party engaged in the encounter). The team concluding
- (a) To identify the victim colour photographs of the victim should be taken;
- (b) Fo recover and preserve evidentiary material, including blood-stained earth hair, fibers and threads, etc., related to the death;
- (c) To identify scene witnesses with complete names, addresses and telephone number and obtain their statements (including the statements of police personnel involved) concerning the death;
- (d) To determine the cause, manner, location (including preparation of rough sketch of topography of the scene and, if possible, photo/video of the scene and any physical evidence) and time of death as well as any pattern or practice that may have brought about the death:

- (e) It must be one too that intact temper, mis of deceased are sent for all appeal analysis and some transfer and stands be located, developed to decided and control or control analysis.
- (f) Post-mortem must be conducted by two doctors in the District Hospital, one of them; as far as possible, should be In-charge/Head of the District Hospital. Post-mortem shall be video-graphed and preserved;
- (g) Any evidence of weapons, such as guns, projectiles, bullets and cartridge cases, should be taken and preserved. Wherever applicable, tests for gunshot residue and trace metal detection should be performed.
- (h) The cause of death should be found out, whether it was natural death, accidental death, suicide or homicide.
- (4) A Magisterial inquiry under Section 176 of the Code must invariably be held-in-all-cases-of-death-which-occur-in the course of-police firing and a report thereof must be sent to Judicial Magistrate having jurisdiction under Section 190 of the Code.
- (5) The involvement of NHRC is not necessary unless there is serious doubt about independent and impartial investigation. However, the information of the incident without any delay must be sent to NHRC or the State Human Rights Commission, as the case may be.
- (6) The injured criminal/victim should be provided medical aid and his/her statement recorded by the Magistrate or Medical Officer with certificate of fitness.
- (7) It should be ensured that :there is no delay in sending FIR, diary entries, panchnamas, sketch, etc., to the concerned Court.
- (8) After full investigation into the incident, the report should be sent to the competent court under Section 173 of the Code. The trial, pursuant to the chargesheet submitted by the Investigating Officer, must be concluded expeditiously.
- (9) In the event of death, the next of kin of the alleged criminal/victim must be informed at the earliest.


- must be sent to NHRC by DGFs. It must be ensured that the six monthly statements reach to NHRC by 15th day of January and July, respectively. The statements may be sent in the following format along with post mortem, inquest and, wherever available, the inquiry reports:
 - (i) Date and place of occurrence.
 - (ii) Police Station, District.
 - (iii) Circumstances leading to deaths:
 - (a) Self defence in encounter.
 - (b) In the course of dispersal of unlawful assembly.
 - (c) In the course of affecting arrest.
 - (iv) Brief facts of the incident.
 - (v) Criminal Case No.
 - (vi) Investigating Agency.
 - (vii) Findings of the Magisterial Inquiry/Inquiry by Senior Officers:
 - (a) Disclosing, in particular, names and designation of, police officials, if found responsible for the death; and
 - (b) Whether use of force was justified and action taken was lawful.
- (11) If on the conclusion of investigation the materials/evidence having come on record show that death had occurred by use of firearm amounting to offence under the IPC, disciplinary action against such officer must be promptly initiated and he be placed under suspension.
- (12) As regards compensation to be granted to the dependants of the victim who suffered death in a police encounter, the scheme provided under Section 357-A of the Code must be applied.
- (13) The police officer(s) concerned must surrender his/her weapons for forensic and ballistic analysis, including any other material, as required by the investigating team, subject to the rights under Article 20 of the Constitution.
- (14) An intimation about the incident must also be sent to the police officer's family and should- the family need services of a lawyer / counselling, same must be offered.

The above guidelines will also be applicable to grievous injury cases in police encounter, as for as possible.

Subject:-

Revised policy/instructions regarding payment of ex-gratia grant to the family member of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) and Central Para Military Forces (CPMF) killed in operational area terrorist activities belonging to Haryana State.

Reference is made to this office memo No. 5/19/2005-2 HC dated 4.1.2006 and dated 30.01.2014 on the subject cited above.

The Governor of Haryana is pleased to enhance the rate of ex-gratia grant to be given to the family members of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) and Central Para Military Forces etc. who died in harness or disable in the performance of their bonafide official duties while serving in operational areas in war or terrorist / militant attack. The Governor of Haryana is further pleased to enlarge the scope of the payment of ex-gratia grant to include contingencies like performance of their duties during natural calamities, elections, rescue operations etc. which demands extra coverage and decisions towards performance of their duties. The revised structure will be as under:-

- In this connection it is intimated that matter was referred to DOP&T but it has been advised by them that CCS (Pension) Rules are not applicable to the officers who joined the service in Central Govt on or after 01.01.2004 and the past military service rendered by them can not be counted towards civil pension as no rules for such officers are available. It has also been clarified that the provisions of <u>DOP&T OM No 28/30/2004-P&PW(8)</u> dated 26.07,2005 are also not applicable in this case as these provisions are attracted only for cases involving technical resignation from one post to join other post.
- It is observed that the officers are representing time and again on the same subject and on the same ground and the concerned Units, Sectors, Ftrs & TCs are also forwarding the same to Dte. Geni., knowing fully that pension rules are not applicable for Govi. Servants appointed on or after 01,01,2004. Therefore, it has been desired by Competent Authority to inform all concerned to advise the officers working under their command not to make unnecessary correspondence on the issues which can not be addressed under the existing rules.
